Preface

Language barriers, going beyond Goshiro Yamamoto

I have always felt that there is a language barrier. Francis Xavier is famous as the first missionary to introduce Christianity to Japan in 1549,

However, there were many problems in evangelizing an unknown country like Japan. Among them, the language barrier was a big problem. One of the language-related problems was

the difficulty translating the ultimate existence of the one and only absolute God into Japanese. At first, it was translated as "Dainichi" for missionary work, but people thought he came to propagate a new Buddhism, being confused with the Buddhist Dainichi Nyorai. Next, it was translated as "Deus" from Latin Deus, and then as "Tenshu" as in the name of churches built in Oura and Urakami in the late Edo and Meiji periods. After some twists and turns, the present "God" has been settled.

One of the major achievements of the Christian religion is the translation of the Bible. The Bible was translated into Latin by Hieronymus, into German by Martin Luther, and into Japanese in various forms. This may seem normal, but although Buddhist sutras and the Qur'an (Koran) in Islam have been translated, official religious institutions, temples, and mosques use a language other than modern Japanese. These two religions are still foreign, but even the ancient Japanese Shinto religion prays in a language far removed from modern Japanese, with the words, "Takamanoharani Kamuzumarimasu sumeragamutsukamurogi

Kamurominomikotomochite." In this sense, the Bible is unique in that it has been translated into every language and revised many times. Finally, I have met Francis Xavier. I will save that story for the next time.

Report on Japan East Reginal Convention

The 26th Japan East Regional Convention was held at APIO Kofu in Kofu City, Yamanashi Prefecture, on June 3-4, 2023. This Regional Convention was the first time to be held face-to-face in four years due to the Corona Pandemic. Six members of the Kawagoe Club (honorifics omitted), Miki Okawa, Keiko Tonegawa, Taro Tonegawa, Junko Yamazaki, Kimiyo Yoshida, and Goshiro Yamamoto, participated in the event, and the total number of participants was less than 300.

I attended the Delegates' Meeting on Saturday the 3rd at 11:00. The opening event, banner ceremony, and opening ceremony followed in the afternoon. Then, Mr. Kenjiro Ishimaru gave a commemorative lecture. His talk was light-hearted and covered many topics, including mountain climbing, ink painting, and being an author, but time passed quickly. During the speech, I sold goods such as Kawagoe's specialty, sweet potato sweets, and Y's Forest Coffee. All the goods were sold out except for the coffee (beans). Well, I bought a lot of things at the other booths.



The dinner started as planned, with a soprano singer who is also a member of the Kofu 21 Club. After that, there were greetings and other remarks, and the time until the toast was a little long.

Anyway, the Kawagoe club members were also seated in separate places this time, as it was meant to be a fellowship event. I was sitting at the same table as Mr. Tamegai (Tokyo Machida Smiling Club). Tamegai-san has ties to Salem, USA, and Pangasinan, Philippines, and he participated in Kawagoe Club meetings several times via Zoom.



There was a hefty rain on June 2, the day before the convention, and I know some members could not come because of that. However, the Kofu 21 Club staff did a wonderful job organizing the event itself, and they were very attentive to the event's details. Next year, we will be in Tokachi. In commemoration of the 100th anniversary of the establishment of Y's Men International, three projects were carried out in the Asia Pacific Area, one of which was the creation of a songbook. The Saitama Club President, Shunichiro Asaba, chaired the committee, and the songbook was distributed to the participants of the 100th anniversary celebration in Taipei in March.

The songbook consists of: Chapter 1: Past Y's Songs, newly created Y's Songs, and songs that exist but are no longer sung; Chapter 2: Songs written and composed by Y's members (including "To You" by Ms. Shima Miyagawa of our DBC Kitakyushu Club); Chapter 3: Representative songs from countries in the Asia Pacific Area; and Chapter 4: Popular songs from around the world.

The YMI of Japan has chosen to commemorate the 100th anniversary with a new poem to the melody of Beethoven's "Ode to Joy," entitled "A Better Place." The lyrics can be found on page 9 of the songbook, up to the 5th verse, but due to space limitations, only the 1st verse is included here. Please try to sing it.

There are a variety of new Y's songs, from originals to dubbed songs, which are very intriguing. "The Y's Way," a variation of the Italian folk song

"Funiculi Funicula," was written by President Asaba.

< A place for YMCA graduates >

"I realized how important the YMCA was to me when I left," and "Thanks to attending the YMCA, I can now make phone calls" - these are the words of a YMCA member who graduated last March.

The reasons for attending the YMCA are different, but they are often due to difficulties in communication, truancy, or other challenges in life. While I am happy to hear these "words," at the same time, I am concerned about whether or not they will be able to manage it when they stop attending the YMCA.

Terminating the After-school Day Care Service (6 to 18 years old) and public services results in arising difficulties after finding a job or going on to higher education. Those diagnosed with developmental disabilities continue to work for an average of 3 years. From this data, we can read that it is difficult to continue working.

Therefore, the YMCA offers a monthly activity called "Up" to give graduates a "place to stay" and a chance to "get better."

In addition to participation, we also provide a place for them to call and ask how they are doing and hear their concerns. Currently, there are 32 enrolled students. The YMCA would like to continue to be involved with them under the slogan, "The YMCA is a lifelong support group.
